**ORDER GRANTING DISCRETIONARY EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 262.023 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE FOR AN ITEM NECESSARY TO PRESERVE OR PROTECT THE PUBLIC SAFETY OF THE RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTY**


**WHEREAS**, Section 262.023 of the Texas Local Government Code requires the Commissioners Court to comply with competitive bidding procedures for purchase of one or more items under a contract that will require an expenditure exceeding \$50,000; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 262.024(a)(2) of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes the Commissioners Court to grant an exemption for "an item necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the residents of the county"; and

**WHEREAS**, Comal County wishes to procure Remington 870 Shotguns from Bailey's House of Guns, Inc. an authorized Remington Law Enforcement dealer for the State of Texas to be used by the Comal County Sheriff's Office to preserve and protect the public safety of the residents of Comal County, Texas;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FOR COMAL COUNTY THAT:** The provisions of Texas Local Government Code §262.024(a)(2) shall apply to exempt the procurement with Bailey's House of Guns for the procurement of Sheriff's Office Firearms from the competitive bidding procedures because it qualifies as an item needed to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the residents of the county.
